At the June 9, 2021 Board of Directors Meeting, the following policies will be on the agenda for 2<sup>nd</sup> Read:

#### SUSPENSION OF STUDENTS

The Board delegates to the principals the authority to suspend disobedient and disorderly students for a period not to exceed ten (10) school days. Suspensions may be in-school or out-of-school at the discretion of the principal. Suspensions longer than 10 days may be imposed by the Board. The Board may impose suspensions longer than 10 days.

Prior to the suspension, except as hereinafter provided:

- A. The student shall be given oral or written notice of the charge(s) against him/her them;
- B. The student shall be given an explanation of the evidence forming the basis for the charge(s); and
- C. The student shall be given an opportunity to present his/her their version of the incident.

However, students whose presence poses a continuing danger to persons or property or an ongoing threat of disrupting the instructional process may be immediately removed from school. In such cases, the notice of charges, explanation of evidence, and the student's opportunity to present his/her their version of the incident shall be arranged as soon as practicable, not to exceed five days, after removal of the student from school.

The student's parents/guardians shall be notified of any in-school or out-of-school suspension as soon as practicable by telephone (if possible) and by written notice sent by mail and by email if possible. A copy of the notice shall also be sent to the Superintendent.

Students are not allowed on school property during any out-of-school suspension except with the prior authorization of the principal or Superintendent. Students serving out-of-school suspensions shall not be permitted to participate in extracurricular activities.

Students shall be responsible for any schoolwork missed during their suspension. After readmittance, they shall be permitted to take tests, quizzes or any other form of evaluation affecting their grades.

Students assigned to in-school suspensions are expected to work on assignments from classroom teachers, remain in the in-school suspension location throughout the school day, and follow school expectations for conduct. Students serving in-school suspension shall not be permitted to participate in extracurricular activities.

#### DISCIPLINARY REMOVAL OF STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

When removing students with disabilities from their regular school programs, whether as a result of a suspension, an expulsion, or any other removal covered by state and federal special education laws, it shall be the policy of RSU No. 5 to comply fully with all applicable state and federal special education laws that govern such removals.

The Superintendent of Schools, in consultation with the Director of Instructional Support and other school administrators, may shall develop and promulgate procedures for implementing this policy, and may from time to time amend those procedures as necessary, and shall fully advise all students and parents/guardians of these procedures.

WHEREAS, the School Board on June 9, 2021 ordered that Warrants be issued forthwith and sent out for assessing the municipalities comprising the RSU their proportionate shares, said shares being in accordance with existing statutes and the method of sharing costs among the member municipalities of the RSU, and for paying the same to the Treasurer of the RSU;

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the provisions of sections 1451-1512 of Title 20-A of the Maine Revised Statutes, you are hereby required in the name of the State of Maine and the RSU to assess the sum of \$5,462,383.57 (the "Town's School Assessment"), upon the taxable estates within the Town according to the provisions of law for the assessment of taxes; and in making the Town's School Assessment, you are required to add the sum aforesaid to the amount of state, county and municipal taxes to be assessed by you.

WHEREAS, the School Board has determined that the total budgeted appropriations for the period of July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022, minus all other anticipated revenues of \$7,109,708.76, requires the sum of \$28,605,155.13 to be assessed against the member municipalities of the RSU, for the Fiscal Year Period; and

WHEREAS, the School Board on June 9, 2021 ordered that Warrants be issued forthwith and sent out for assessing the municipalities comprising the RSU their proportionate shares, said shares being in accordance with existing statutes and the method of sharing costs among the member municipalities of the RSU, and for paying the same to the Treasurer of the RSU;

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the provisions of sections 1451-1512 of Title 20-A of the Maine Revised Statutes, you are hereby required in the name of the State of Maine and the RSU to assess the sum of \$3,222,789.64 the "Town's School Assessment"), upon the taxable estates within the Town according to the provisions of law for the assessment of taxes; and in making the Town's School Assessment, you are required to add the sum aforesaid to the amount of state, county and municipal taxes to be assessed by you.

And you are alike required to pay or issue your warrants to the several constables or collectors of the Town requiring them respectively to levy and collect the Town's School Assessment, and to pay to the Treasurer of the Town the aforesaid sum set against the Town, to be paid by the Treasurer of the Town to the Treasurer of the RSU in twelve substantially equal monthly installments on or before the 20th of each of the months, commencing July 20 of the Fiscal Year Period.

Vice-Chair	See attached policy BDB
Negotiations	Two or three members for professional and two members for support staff. Take part in active contract negotiations on behalf of the school system with each employee union. Activities may involve negotiating successor agreements. The major time commitment arises when current contracts require renewal.
Policy	Three members. Policy topics and issues are generated by referral from the Board, at the request of the Superintendent, changes in law and recommendations from MSMA. Meets monthly.
Finance	Three members, one representative from each town per policy. Committee provides oversight for finance operations of the RSU. Meets at 5:00pm before the first Board meeting of the month
Strategic Communications	Two or Three members. The Strategic Communications Committee provides oversight for the Strategic Framework implementation and facilitates communication between the RSU5 Board and the public. Typically meets four times a year.
RSU5 Community Programs Advisory Council	One member. This group is advisory to Community Programs. A board member attends regularly as a liaison.
Maine Region Ten Technical High School	Two Board members serve on the Maine Region Ten Technical High School Board of Directors. Meetings are held monthly at Region 10 (3 <sup>rd</sup> Monday of the month) All traditional Board functions are carried out by the Region 10 board which is made up of representatives of the three sending school towns (Brunswick, Freeport and SAD 75) Note: we have filled one of the positions with a community member in the past.
Dropout Prevention	One Board member per policy serves as a representative. The committee is charged with meeting at least annually to plan for decreasing the number of students who do not complete their education. Meetings are scheduled for 2:30 p.m.
Stipend Review	Two members sit on the committee per CBA. Contractually any new stipend request comes with Administrator approval to the committee; their recommendation goes to the CEA then the full Board for final action. Reviews all stipend positions periodically. Two to seven meetings per year that take place after 3:45pm.
Student Centered Learning Committee (formerly Proficiency Based Education (PBE) Committee)	One member serves as a representative. The committee is charged with providing guidance and direction to RSU5 implementation of proficiency-based education and ensure alignment K-12. The

committee will coordinate such key issues as policies, standards alignment, professional development and reporting practices.
One member serves as the school representative on the Freeport Cable TV Board. Meetings are held at least quarterly.
One member serves. The Committee meets two times a year to consider procedures, fees, review data regarding operation of the FPAC.
Two members sit on the committee, charged with annual review/update of the Safety Plans. Meetings vary depending upon the workload. Typically, three meetings a year at 6:50 a.m.
One member. Monthly district Wellness Committee meetings.

#### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS OFFICERS**

#### **Duties of the Chair**

The Chair shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and shall perform other duties as directed by law, Maine Department of Education rules, and by this Board. In carrying out these responsibilities, the Chair shall:

- A. Sign the instruments, acts, and orders necessary to carry out state requirements and the will of the Board of Directors;
- B. Consult with the Superintendent in the planning of the Board meeting agendas and with the Vice Chair as feasible;
- C. Confer with the Superintendent on crucial matters which may occur between Board meetings;
- D. Appoint subcommittees subject to Board approval and serve as an ex-officio member of all such subcommittees;
- E. Call special meetings of the Board of Directors as necessary;
- F. Be the public spokesperson for the Board of Directors at all times except as this responsibility is specifically delegated to others; and
- G. Preside at and be responsible for the orderly conduct of all Board of Directors meetings.

As presiding officer at all meetings of the Board of Directors, the Chair shall:

- A. Call the meeting to order at the appointed time;
- B. Announce the business to come before the Board in its proper order;
- C. Enforce the Board's policies relating to the order of business and the conduct of meetings;
- D. Recognize persons who desire to speak, and protect the speaker who has the floor from disturbance or interference;
- E. Explain, as appropriate, what the effect of a motion would be:

- F. Restrict discussion to a motion that is before the Board:
- G. Put motions to a vote and announce the vote result.

The Chair shall have the right, as other Board members have, to offer motions, discuss questions, and vote.

#### **Duties of the Vice-Chair**

In the absence of the Chair, the Vice-Chair shall perform all the duties of the Chair.

#### **Duties of the Secretary**

The Superintendent shall serve as Secretary of the Board of Directors, with the right to speak on all questions and offer recommendations. The Superintendent/designee shall be responsible for ensuring that records are kept of all business transacted by the Board at both regular and appropriately called special meetings, and shall perform such other functions as are ordinarily functions of this office.
